

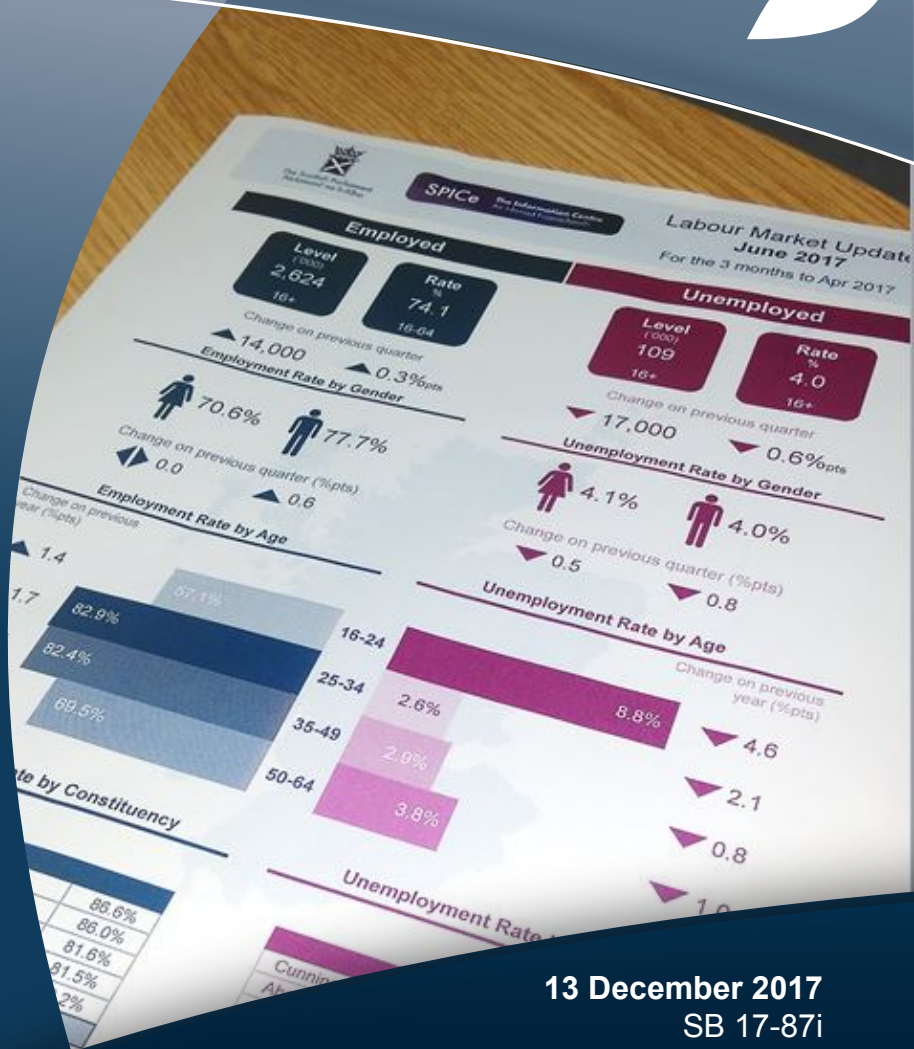

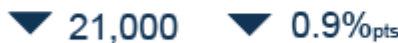

### Employment Rate by Gender

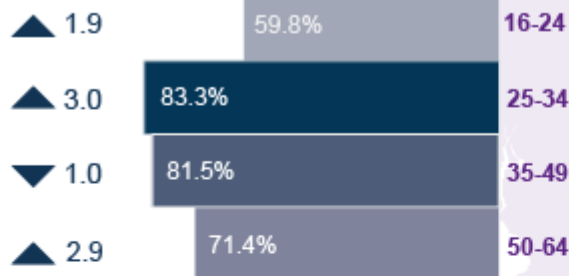


Change on previous quarter (%pts)

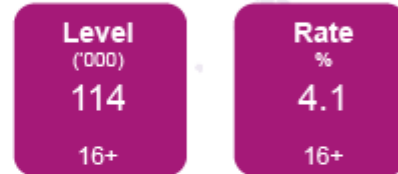

### Unemployment Rate by Gender

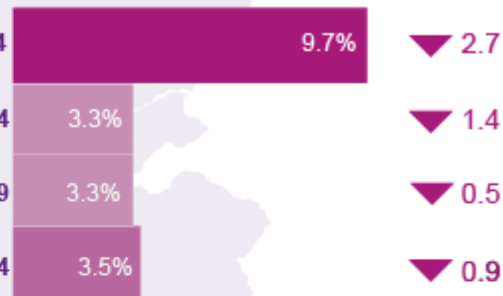


Change on previous quarter (%pts)
