

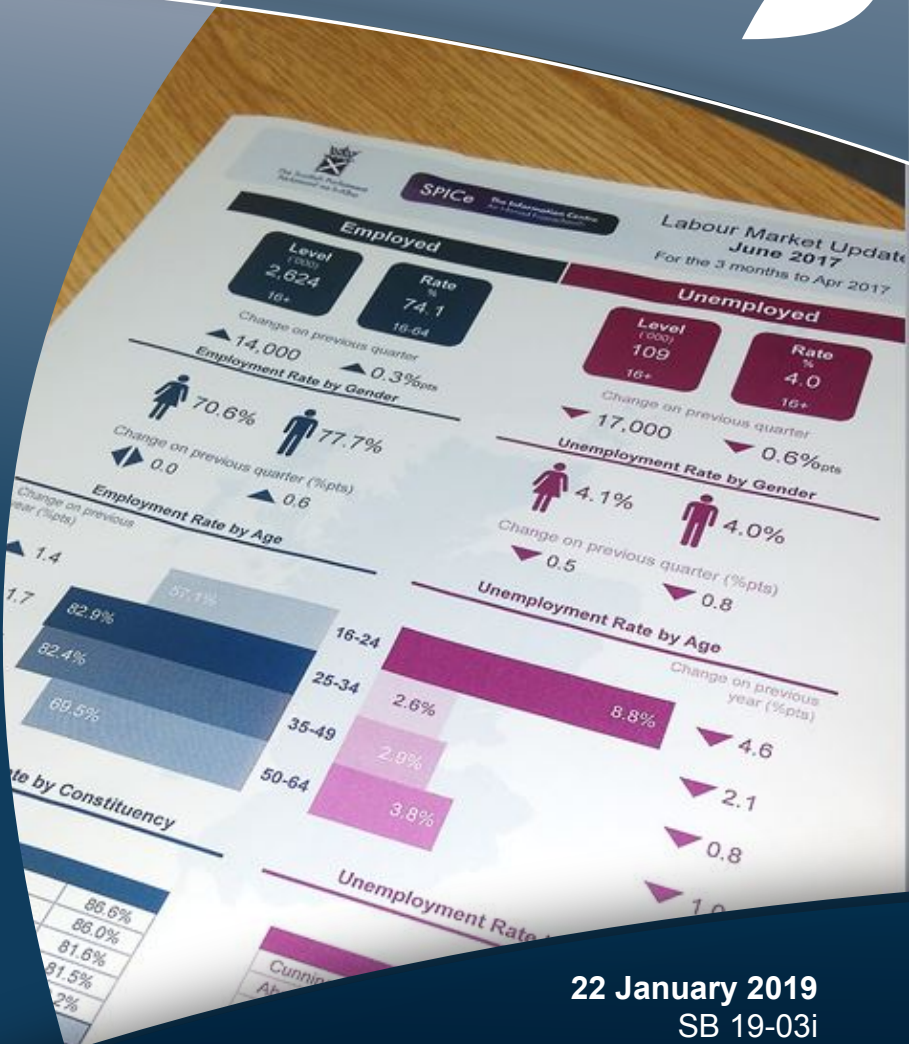

Employment Rate by Gender

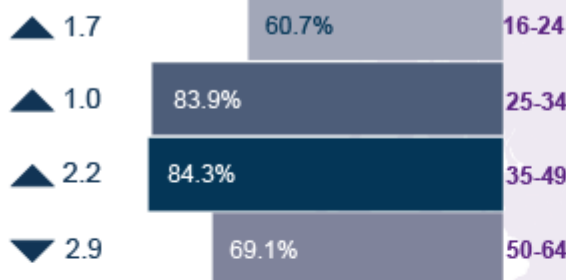


Change on previous quarter (%pts)

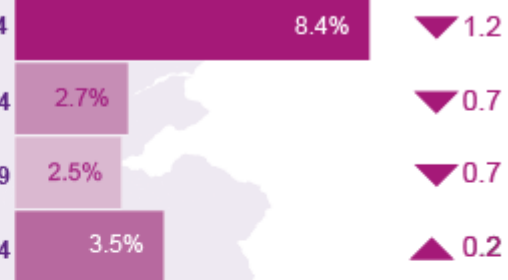
